### Ontario's Green Energy Act and Feed-in Tariff Program



- 1. FITs are financed from rate-base not the treasury (stimulus does not compete with social priorities)
- 2. Long-Term premiums for wind, solar, biomass, microhydro (20 years)
- 3. Premiums are designed for specific technologies
- Community power and First Nations Projects get an added premium
- Community power fund to help projects reach commercial stage



### **Key Lessons**



- 1. Crucial to explain to the public the costs to each family's electricity bill and highlight benefits (new jobs, protection of children's health, better power, cleaner air, safer community)
- Do not underestimate your adversaries or take for granted your allies
- 3. Inspire your politicians
- Invest a lot on local capacity building and cultivating strong and numerous allies (trades, unions, teachers, preachers, community groups)
